Delinquent taxes lower

A total of \$17,286.25 in delinquent taxes in 1984 was reported at the June 18 meeting of fiscal court.

Sherril Charles Hays was given the following credits in his settlement of last year's unpaid tax bills: State, \$2,281.18; county, \$1,363.85; school, \$1,992.24; hospital, \$1,288.27; fire, \$628.80; library, \$296.83 and Board of Health, \$47.82.

County Clerk Rose Scott reported that while the figure is still high it is considerably lower than in past years. She attributes the new volume of paying property tax on motor vehicles at the time of car registration for the improvement.

MAGISTRATES approved the reviewing and replacement of the water line which currently runs on the old hospital building on Maxwell Road. The line will be installed around the building, which now houses the Community Action Center, at a cost of approximately \$1,200 for material and supplies.

Also approved were payments of \$5 to members of the Board of Assessment Appeals — Kenneth Stephenson, Woodrow Hickey and James Neal Wood — and county clerk Scott. One-half of the \$100 will be paid by the state.

Minutes were changed to reflect correct payment figures on a number of utility appropriations.

Court will next meet on Wednesday, July 3.

More local park use goal of new manager

is a veteran park system employee, dating back to 1970 when he spent four summers on western Kentucky parks while attending Murray State University. After graduating with a degree in business management he was named business manager at Cumberland Falls and later Jerry White state parks. He entered private business in Bardonia in 1976, selling out in 1984 to become manager of Greenbriar State Park near Ashland.

Devine, who succeeded Richard Law, is married to the former Brenda Devine of Bardonia, where they make their home in the old manor. He is a member of the Bardonia Rotary Club. Devine hopes to make a number of local contacts in the interest of promoting park attendance throughout the week as well as weekends. He has a number of "regulars" from the immediate area and feels that more would make it if the service.

His rates for campers are \$4 to \$6 per person, with an additional charge of \$1 for per person over age six.

While the Division of Parks places most of its emphasis and budget on resort parks, Devine feels that with a little help and a lot of local participation Blue Licks will climb from its lowly attendance rank.

"People from this area use it a great deal more than they've visited. And I have to agree with them," Devine said. It would be prettier, he adds, if more of its 100 acres were filled with people enjoying nature on a historical setting.

"I want to see if local people will tell me what they want included so I do everything possible to provide it."
