Blue Licks has two smaller houses. One is 22'x40' and seats about 120 people. This will rent for \$20. The other is 22'x20' and seats about 80 people. Rental is \$10.

An aluminum storage building attached to the back of Frodores Foodmart was ripped from its pinning set in concrete and deposited

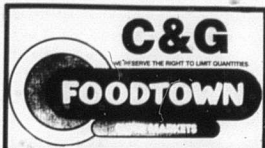
Sharpshooter Water District regular meeting March 12

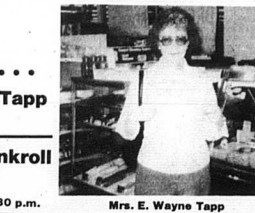
