FmHA hiring temporary help to service loans

The Farmers Home Administration will hire additional temporary employees to help process farm loans this year, according to an announcement by Kentucky, FmHA State Director Kenneth L. Sweeney. Sweeney said the new temporary employees will be hired to help service farm loans. "We will begin hiring the extra staff this month," Sweeney said. "The new employees will be temporary. They will serve for four months to help with seasonal loan peak and to process applications for Amended Farm Loans who have requested a review of their new debt restructuring program." Sweeney said the temporary employees will be hired to help service farm loans who have requested a review of their new debt restructuring program. "The new program, farmers who are having trouble meeting their Farm Loan payments may have their loans restructured or have up to 20 percent of their loans up to \$200,000 not earlier than five years with no interest. Farm loans held by commercial banks and other lenders that are classified as "problem loans" can be reduced by 10 percent to \$100,000. "The additional personnel will be assigned to FmHA offices where the workload is greater," Sweeney said. "The new temporary employees will include both specialists and clerical staff members to handle the increased workload." Sweeney said the new temporary employees will be hired to help service farm loans who have requested a review of their new debt restructuring program.
