## Tobacco meetings scheduled

A series of 10 regional meetings will be held across Kentucky in early April to acquaint tobacco growers with details of a plan to withdraw the tobacco price support program.  
The plan, which combines price support reductions with a phased drawdown of surplus stocks and a cap on net cost assessments, was worked out recently during negotiations involving R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, Kentucky Farm Bureau, the Kentucky Tobacco Growers' Cooperative Association and the Barley Farmers' Advisory Council.  
Kentucky Farm Bureau President Ray Mackey says the upcoming meetings may be the "most important in a generation" to Kentucky farmers.  
Farm Bureau's Tobacco Advisory Committee recently endorsed the plan.

Mackey said that a number of the growers' organization meetings will be held at each of the meetings. Local meetings are scheduled Monday, April 8 at Mason County Fairgrounds in Mayfield, and Thursday, April 11 at the U.S. Goodale Farm, University of Kentucky. All begin at 7 p.m.
