Surplus cheese distributions cut in half

The reduction in allocation will not permit Community Action to serve all eligible participants on a monthly basis. In order to ensure that all participants are served, Community Action will begin distributing surplus commodities only every other month effective this month.

Unemployed rate drops in county
Unemployment rates rose in 47 counties between August and September as the state recorded a slight increase in rates between the two months, according to figures released by the Cabinet Job Training Resources.
In 47 counties, including Nicholas, the September rates were lower than August's, while in six counties the rates were unchanged.
Sixty-four counties reported rates of 10.8 percent or above in September, down from 11 in August.
Compared to September 1984, 84 counties had higher rates, 22 had lower rates and four counties reported the same rates.
Nicholas County reported a 8.0 percent unemployment for September, down from 11 in August.
Increases in education enrollment were offset by fewer jobs in trade, manufacturing, real estate and construction, pushing the rate up, according to state labor market analyst Ed Blackwell.
