Applications for HEAP - begin Oct. 21

The Cabinet for Human Resources will begin taking applications Oct. 21 for the initial payment of the 1985-86 Kentucky Energy Assistance Program (HEAP).

HEAP helps pay the cost of electricity, gas, coal, wood oil, bottled gas or other heating fuels. Eligible households facing a heating crisis will receive blankets, space heaters, emergency fuel supplies or other necessities.

APPLICANTS must verify and document utility bills or fuel type and income of the household and of any family member. In the case of a heating crisis, the low income loss of heating must be verified.

The final HEAP payment runs from Jan. 1 to May 31 for very heating households, either without heat, facing the loss of heat, or facing disconnection by a utility or pending repairs to the heating system.
