Halloween precautions can avert tragedies

Halloween's fun frights can quickly become tragic if certain precautions are not taken. The Cabinet for Human Resources, through its Consumer Health Protection Division, recommends tips for trick-or-treaters and their parents who youngsters make their rounds between 5 p.m. and 8 p.m. Host mothers, such as jack-o-lantern candles, can set costumes afire. Wax, masks and costumes should be made of flame-retardant material. Avoid costumes longer than neckline and those with long, flowing sleeves and capes. Costumes and shoes should be comfortable. Avoid high heels. Little children not ready yet to walk should be accompanied by a parent. Parents should check every piece of candy for tampering. Discard any homemade treats or fresh fruit from strangers. Allow children to eat only factory-wrapped candy. Because of the danger of fallacies and razor blades, it is a good idea to cut all fruit into cubes. Do not allow children to eat any candy that appears to have been tampered with. Lighted houses welcome children. These without lights on them are avoided. Neighbors should be well-known. Do not go to parties where you are not known. For greater visibility, costumes and masks should be brightly colored. Avoid costumes that are large enough to permit good vision. Emphasize everyday safety with children. Do not accept rides from strangers. Use sidewalks and lawns may have furrows or ruts. Do not walk on them. Do not walk on the dark. Avoid high traffic areas. Always allow young children to walk on sidewalks. Parents should avoid treating in areas of each house. Older children are safer in small groups.
