Home health agency would serve county

The Cabinet for Human Resources has scheduled a public hearing Oct. 24 on proposals to establish home health agencies to serve residents in nine counties.

According to its proposal, Four Counties Services of 1971 Ridge would establish a home health agency to serve residents in Gallatin, Grant, Owen and Pendleton counties. The agency would be established with a capital expenditure of \$100,000.

A proposal from Harrison Memorial Home Health Agency of Cynthiana would establish a home health agency to serve residents of Cynthiana, Hartsville, Nicholas, Robertson, Boyle, Grant and Owen counties. The proposal involves no capital expenditure.

The hearing is set to begin at 9 a.m. Oct. 24 in the first floor auditorium in the Department for Health Services building, 275 East Main Street, Frankfort. It will be moderated by a hearing officer on behalf of the Kentucky Health Facilities and Health Services Certificate of Need and Licensure Board, which plans to review the proposal on Nov. 20.
