Eye Openers

IS YOUR CHILD READY FOR SCHOOL?

Millions of children are going to school for the first time this month. Parents and teachers expect these youngsters to learn quickly, and participate actively in classroom activities. But many of these youngsters won't be because they don't see efficiently. Some children will not have sufficient visual maturity to read at this point, and others will need professional help to get their visual skills up to par.

In order to achieve at school, a child needs:
*adequate visual acuity at near (for reading and writing)
*clear distance vision (for blackboard and charts)
*the ability for both eyes to work together as a team in a wide field of vision

Good focusing ability and eye/hand coordination are also extremely important in the early learning process. Free schools are equipped to perform complete tests of visual skills. It is important to have your child's eyes thoroughly examined BEFORE school gets underway.
