### Tobacco fight finally won

**—** At long last, we did it. We pushed through a hostile Congress a bill that will bring long-term stability to the ailing tobacco program. Considering the increasing anti-tobacco sentiment in Washington, we passed the legislation just in time.

**—** There is a lack of understanding of the importance of tobacco as a crop, how the tobacco program works, and why we ended up with the surplus that threatened the program. Since I first introduced the bill, along with Senator Mitch McConnell, I have spent hours explaining the problems to nearly every senator on an individual basis. More importantly, I detailed how the new program will solve these problems by making growers and manufacturers partners in commerce.

**—** In January 1984, the Secretary of Agriculture proposed phasing out tobacco program quotas and allotments. Bills were introduced in Congress to abolish the program without a phase-out period. It was a call to arms, and led me to meet several times with the Secretary to explain tobacco woes. He agreed to omit these tobacco measures from the 1986 Farm Bill as long as a market-oriented solution was developed.

**—** Kentucky's farm leadership sped to the scene with proposals developed earlier by growers in their "Nine Point Plan." Together we convinced the manufacturers that participation in the plan would benefit them and farmers alike.

**—** We began with a bargaining chip: the cigarette excise tax, which was scheduled to roll back to 8 cents last fall. In exchange for agreeing to drop opposition to retaining the tax at the 16-cent level, we were able to get our measure, the Tobacco Reform Act of 1986, included in the Budget Reconciliation Bill.
