## Kay's Kitchen

This week some quick and easy desserts to serve with the recipe I gave you last week to round out the meal. All are made ahead, so no last minute work to be done.

### RASPBERRY YELVET PIE

1 (16 oz.) package frozen raspberries, thawed  
1 (16 oz.) package raspberry flavored gelatin  
1 cup boiling water  
1/4 lb. (8 oz.) marshmallows  
1 cup heavy cream, whipped  
Vanilla wafer  
Drain berries, reserving syrup. Add enough water to syrup to make 1 cup. Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Add marshmallows; beat till partially set. Add reserved syrup, chili till partially set. Beat till fluffy and peaks form. Fold in berries and mixture cream. Line a 9-inch pie plate with vanilla wafers, fill with mixture and chill till set. Serve with additional whipped cream if desired.

### STRAWBERRY DELIGHT

2 cups whipping cream  
1/2 cup dried sweet chocolate  
2 tablespoons powdered sugar  
2 tablespoons rum flavoring  
1 quart fresh strawberries  
Whip cream until foamy and barely thick. Fold in chocolate, sugar and flavoring. Chill. Serve as a sauce over capped strawberries.

### LEMON-COCOAUT DESSERT

1 (16 oz.) can Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk  
1/2 cup lemon juice  
1 tablespoon grated lemon rind  
1/2 cup flaked coconut  
1 cup whipping cream  
Blend milk, lemon juice and rind in large bowl. Fold in whipping cream and coconut. Spoon into individual serving dishes. Chill 1 hour or until set. Serve garnished with whipped cream.

### HEAVENLY HUSH DESSERT

2 eggs  
1 (8 oz.) can sliced pineapple, drained and chopped  
1/2 cup marshmallows, chopped  
2 bananas, sliced  
2 oranges, peeled, sectioned and cut up  
1/2 cup chopped pecans  
2 cups miniature marshmallows  
1 cup sweetened whipped cream  
Combine all ingredients and chill thoroughly. Serve in dessert dishes, 10 to 12 servings.
