Coaches in jobs 1161 Drane was just a natural for the thing."

That's how University of Kentucky coach Eddie Sutton explained the appointment of Dewey Casey as assistant basketball coach replacing Leonard Hamilton last Friday.

"When I got down to 3-4 people candidates I did a lot of cross checking with coaches I know and I could not find one person, not one, with a bad thing to say about Dewey Casey," Sutton said, adding that he received 75 applicants, among them a dozen head coaches.

And so, Casey, a native of Union county and a member of UK's national championship team in 1976, has gone back to Lexington to put on blue and white once more.

"I'm excited to be back at UK and honored to be chosen over so many applicants," Casey said. "This is a dream come true for me and it means a lot because when I came here as a student freshman I was glad to be there. Now I have an opportunity to give something back to this program."

Casey was an assistant at Western Kentucky the last six years and says he was asked to stay on by WKU's new coach Murray Arnold.

"But the chance to work under coach Sutton and be back at Kentucky is just a good opportunity for me," Casey said.

Sutton was Casey's being named head coach on the job. His reply was noble but about as surprising as the news of Casey's appointment.

"I never hear a person just because of the fact that they should never be an issue of course, but it will be when the assistant coach goes on to be a coaching trail."

But Casey added this: "The thing that impressed me about Coach Sutton was that he said he didn't want just a replacement. He wanted someone to contribute in other coaching areas."

WKL hires Arnold

Murray Arnold, 48, was a surprise choice at Western Kentucky in light of some of the applicants. But certainly has the right credentials—experience, recruiting success and winning and apparently without cheating to do it.

In six years at Tennessee Chattanooga he guided the Magic Johnson Southern Conference titles, three trips to the NCAA and two to the NIT.

In eight seasons at Birmingham Southern, Arnold had a 139-78 record, 62 wins percent, and added before that he was an assistant to Hugh Durham at Florida State during the Seminoles hey days 1982-83.

Recruiting? Arnold knows where to find players and has good contacts. He started his coaching career at DePue, High School under Morgan Wood.

Murray likes good, tough man-made defense, a former coach at Tennessee Chattanooga said Wednesday. He likes a controlled fast break offense and personnel who he prefers speed and quick players over power types. It's worked for him.

If there is a knock on Arnold it is that he thinks basketball is the only sport there is and he thinks you ought to think that way too.

So Arnold is a blue collar coach with white collar respectability as his profession. Just what Western needs.

Crum coach of year

The Spring News hailed Leonardville's Benny Crum as coach of the year last week. That's more, but lame duck. At least, any coach who marches his team to a national title ought to be coach of the year.

Crum gives his success rate this decade. Crum ought to be named to coach America's Olympic team in 1988.

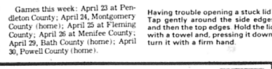
Track meets given to the top six finishers in each event. Below is a list of the events and the finish of those who scored points.
