Prior year tax returns available

Taxpayers who have not retained copies of prior year tax returns can either request the returns or transcripts of tax accounts, according to the Internal Revenue Service. Either request can be made on Form 406, "Request for Copy of Tax Form or Tax Account Information."

Charge for photocopies of prior year returns is \$4.25 per return. Alternatively, transcripts of tax account information will be provided for \$2.25 per tax year. The tax account information includes type of return filed, marital status, tax shown on return, adjusted gross income, taxable income, self-employment tax and number of exemptions.

Full payment must accompany all orders. Taxpayers should allow at least 45 days for delivery when requesting photocopies of prior year returns, and at least 30 days when requesting tax account information. Allow at least 10 weeks' processing time after the original return is filed before requesting a copy or information.

Medieval craft featured on KET

The Hurdston Stained Glass Co. in Covington will be producing the next edition of "N.K.Y.," airing Wednesday, April 23 at 7 p.m. on KET.

"N.K.Y." is a weekly public affairs series highlighting the people, places and events from the Northern Kentucky area.

Walter Baumback is the present owner and operator of the stained glass company, delicately performing the craft as it was established in the 18th century. He was studying to become an Austrian monk and learned the craft as an apprentice in the stained glass studio of the monastery. Baumback's parents immigrated to Cincinnati in 1902 and he followed some years later, joining a job at the Hurdston Glass Co. founded by an Irish immigrant named John Hurdston. The advent of television forced the unique company to move and eventually it settled on the second floor of a Scott Street warehouse in Covington, where it has remained ever since.

Advancing age forced the retirement of Hurdston and Baumback purchased the company. He comments on the laborious process of making a stained glass window and viewers are treated to what appears to be a jigsaw puzzle.
