### Nicholas jobless rates down

More than 26,000 Kentuckians found jobs between May and June which helped push jobless rates down in 83 counties, according to figures released by the Cabinet for Human Resources. In 34 counties the rates went up during the same period and in three they remained the same. The number of counties reporting double-digit unemployment also declined. In June, 63 counties reported jobless rates at 10.3 percent or above, compared to 68 in May and 64 in June 1985. The local unemployment figures mirrored a decline in the state rate, from a revised 12 percent in May to a preliminary 8.9 percent in June, the lowest rate since last October, when it was 8.4 percent.

June also marked the first time in eight months the state has posted a jobless rate below 8.5 percent. And it was only the third time since 1979 that the state's unemployment rate had decreased between May and June. Nicholas County showed a 4.5 jobless rate, down from 7.4 in May.
