Use of sulfites violates law

Efficient and safe restaurant or grocery store in Kentucky using sulfites on raw fruits or vegetables will be violating state law, according to the state Department for Health Services. The U. S. Food and Drug Administration has banned the use of sulfites on raw fruits and vegetables, because the chemicals have been linked to severe reactions, including some deaths in allergic persons. Reactions also include hives, nausea, diarrhea, and shortness of breath. Sulfites are used to keep fruit and vegetable fresh-looking.

Immunization certificate now required

The Department for Health Services reminds parents that Kentucky law requires children to have certain immunizations before enrolling in school. "Children in Kentucky must have immunizations against five diseases — diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles and rubella," said Gary Higgins, children, immunization program manager in Health Services. Immunization in grades kindergarten through 12 must present an up-to-date immunization certificate upon entry in school. He said, certificates are available from local health departments or from private physicians. "Children need immunizations against these diseases or the license will return," Higgins added. "These immunizations are very necessary and protect school children from vaccine-preventable childhood diseases." In addition, students must present proof of having had a tuberculosis skin test. First-time students in schools that have a one-half of one percent tuberculosis incidence rate must have had a TB skin test within 12 months of enrollment. Questions about school TB rates can be directed to local health boards or local health departments.
