'86 football rule changes implemented

The 1986 football season was rife with rule changes. Some of the changes will not be noticeable at all, but others are major. For example, Rule 1-3(c), making the only legal ball one with the full stripe, was implemented in 1986. Beginning this year, it is in full effect. From this season, the full stripe ball will be acceptable.

Rule 1-3(a), requiring the NCSAA label on helmets to be on the exterior of the helmet and clearly visible, became effective in 1986. A player may not play with a properly equipped and labeled helmet.

Rule 1-3(b) has had no added to provide in 1986. The rules committee gives this type of change an advance notice to coaches several years to purchase the correct type of equipment.

Changes that will be more evident from the sidelines include the following:

Rule 1-3-3(c), note 2: This addition allows the home team to put a fourth and final substitute on the field during the game, at least two more and remained over the weekend for tests and treatment.

Fall league, tournament at ballpark

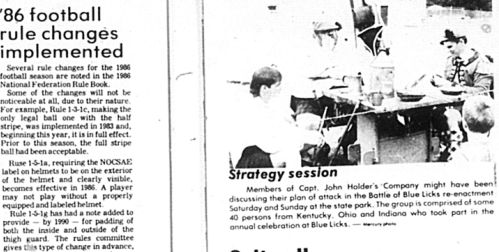

Low interest loan okayed
