Skills Tests results improve statewide

Higher percentages of Kentucky students mastered the essential skills in reading and math this year than last, Superintendent of Public Instruction Alice McDonald has announced.

Students in the state's public schools also continued to improve their scores on the Kentucky Essential Skills Test in relation to national norms.

All Kentuckians — teachers, administrators, parent legislators and others concerned about the state's public schools as the result of the educational reform begun by the 1984 Kentucky Education Reform Act.

ACHIEVEMENT tests administered in April made possible the first two-year comparison of the students' mastery of the essential skills in math and reading and spelling.

CTM/McGrath Hill made an error in the computer program that was used to score spelling tests in all of the schools. The mistake was not detected in the total battery on which the national comparison is based.

Another way of looking at the test results is to see how many Kentucky students scored at or above the national median, which is the 50th percentile.

The percentages of students scoring at mastery levels in math ranged from 90.3 in the first grade to 79.1 in the sixth grade, the report said.

IN READING, the percentages achieving mastery ranged from 87.1 in the first grade to 74.0 in the seventh grade, which was also the lowest on the list.

THE MASTERY percentages in reading were slightly higher than last year for students from kindergarten through grade seven and in grade 11.

THE PERCENTAGES of students demonstrating their mastery of the essential skills were generally higher in the lower grades, McDonald said.

THIS IS NOT a problem limited to Kentucky schools, she said. "However, it is an indication of what we need to do to improve the quality of our schools."

State parks won't carp about fish

An invariable, exotic fish may hold the key to keeping smallmouth bass lakes clear of excess vegetation that can interfere with swimming, boating and fishing.

The state Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources began earlier this year to issue permits allowing importation of the species to help control nuisance vegetation in ponds and small lakes.

John Hudson, commissioner of another Tourism Cabinet agency, the Department of Parks, learned about a fish and wildlife pilot project at a Jefferson County meeting.

"We use herbicides to keep vegetation under control, but that's expensive and they have to be applied several times a year," Hudson said.

IN EARLY July, the Department of Parks issued permits for the release of 100 smallmouth bass into the amount of plant life by the end of the summer season.
