rankings, since were independent districts while only one (Oldham County in 7th) was a county district. "It is very difficult for county-wide districts to be able to compete with the independent districts because the independent districts tend to be smaller and more affluent. This is even mentioned in the newspaper article whose headline notes that the wealthy districts were typically those that scored the best."

"I gave the 18 independent districts that were ranked above us and we are number 26 among all the county-wide districts in the state," Guthrie pointed out. "Elder noted that the reason for his surprise at the test scores was the many factors that could have distracted both teachers and students from the learning process last year. "We spent the majority of the school year preparing for and undergoing a state accreditation, a time consuming task for teachers and administrators alike."

"We also had major storm damage from a tornado in March (just a few weeks before the tests were given) that resulted in less than optimum learning conditions for some time while repairs to both buildings were being made. "These two factors alone could have caused our scores to plummet. A dedicated faculty and motivated students overcome these obstacles to learning. These are the people who deserve the credit for this," Elder concluded.
