College presents program

The Mayville Community College Nursing Faculty will present a professional continuing education conference, "Abuse and Neglect of the Elderly - Is Your Care Lacking?" December 8 from 8:30 a.m. in the MCC Auditorium.

Designed for registered and licensed practical nurses, this conference will focus on the need to increase the awareness of the problem of abuse and neglect in the elderly population and will explore the health professional's role in this sensitive area.

Judith W. Polman, RN, MS, Director of Nursing Education at St. Joseph Hospital in Lexington, will be the presenter.

At the completion of this conference participants should be able to:

1. Describe the scope of the problem of elderly abuse and neglect;
2. Identify the areas of abuse: chemical, physical, psychological;
3. Identify the behavioral and physical indicators of abuse and neglect in both the institutionalized and home-bound elderly population;
4. Explain the reporting law in Kentucky and gain a basic understanding of the procedure which follows reporting;
5. Identify nursing interventions and strategies and services available for persons requiring rehabilitation.

CEU's (three contact hours toward licensure renewal) will be awarded to participants by Mayville Community College. Registration fee for the program is \$12 per participant if registered in advance. To ensure sufficient enrollment to register, prospective participants are requested to register no later than Thursday, December 4.
