## Council passes.....

City revenue, \$26,500,000. Insurance business, five percent of total premiums collected previous year, minimum \$5.

Council member Tyler asked for a called meeting Monday, December 15 at 7 p.m. concerning a new license tax ordinance. Council member Tommy Vaughn, asked if he (Tyler) could wait until the first of the year, Tyler replied, "No."

After looking into the matter of city employee health insurance, Council member Bobby Barnett reported his findings. The city has insurance through Blue Cross/Blue Shield. Presently the monthly payments are family, \$206.70, single, \$124.42. At the first of the year premiums will increase to \$232.76 and \$142.80. However, with Option 2,000, dental and life insurance, the premiums will be \$257.00 family and \$159.50 single.

Council voted to accept this plan on a roll call vote. Carl voted no.

In other business:

Council members Tyler and Barnett suggest that 771 install another security light behind their property on Market Street. Barnett had called to report gasoline, etc. missing from the property.

Mayor received a letter from Barry Madmann of Jockey International stating the company would pay cost of operation of new electric pump at the bottling plant.

Agreed to pay the fire department chief and assistant chief \$19 per fire call in addition to their regular pay.

To make the starting salary for part-time and full-time policemen the same, \$4.52 per hour.

To check on installing caution lights at Carlisle IGA parking lot, Nicholas County Schools, and Jockey International paint entrances.

Mayor Bennett wants the fire department door, just inside the glass front door to the city office, locked at all times. Some people are using the room to sleep in and using

is no way this will happen.

"It would be impossible to continue the service as an independent operator, because of high operating costs," McDonald said.

Shoof did not appear very optimistic about the chances of changing to a less than one year contract.

It (less than a year contract) would take an act of the court.

As far as knowing if termination of the ambulance service contract will take place as planned.

The next meeting of Nicholas County Fiscal Court will be at 2 p.m., December 17.

According to Rob Hester, administrator at Nicholas County Hospital, he made some contact about the possibility of ambulance service from surrounding counties.

Hester said he might contact with services in Bourbon, Harrison, and Fleming counties, and the outlook is tentative at best.

Hester said he was told by all contacted, the out-of-county service would do the best they could to respond, if a unit was available within their own counties.

However, service by the ambulance services to residents of the respective counties had to come first.
