Blind Spots

Every normal eye has a blind spot. The blind spot is actually the projection of the optic nerve, which is the back of the eye. This area acts as the passageway for nerves and blood vessels connecting the eye with the brain. Since there are no light-sensitive elements in this area, you can't see the image of an object that may fall directly onto this area.

However, nature has developed your eyes so that when both are functioning the left eye "sees" the visual object obscured by the blind spot of the right eye, and the right eye "sees" the visual object or area obscured by the blind spot of the left eye.

A person with vision in only one eye should compensate for "the blind spot" by shifting the eye more frequently, especially when driving and participating in sports.

Curious? Next time you come in for an examination, ask how to find your own blind spot.

Try olive oil. Heat until the oil is warm, not hot. Section your hair at 90 degree intervals. When your hair and scalp are saturated, cover with a plastic wrap or a baggie. Leave on overnight, shampoo, oil and water don't mix. You will need to later.

During the first two to four years of the average life span of an individual hair, the hair can grow anywhere from twelve to thirty-five inches.
