Health Tips from Lee Rose

Government by safety regulations require that manufacturers must design toys and make them so hazardous users will not be injured. Because Christmas will bring a flood of toys for all ages, the following is advised from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission.

All toy-related injuries can be prevented by government regulations. New and old toys around the house should be checked for possible hazards.

Teach children to put their toys away on shelves or in a toy chest after playing to prevent tripping and falls.

Toys should be inspected for safety. Use a toy that has a lightweight lid that can be opened easily from within. The lid should not open when raised and not fall back unexpectedly on a child.

Examine toys periodically, with particular care for sharp edges and points that may have developed. Repair broken toys and discard toys that cannot be fixed.

Encourage children to put their toys away so they do not get broken and so that more children can play with them.

See that toys used outdoors are stored after play - rained or snow can rot or damage a variety of toys and toys parts.
