We voted on bills ranging from automobile insurance to veterans in the Senate last week in a very busy session.

We approved a bill that would stop insurance companies from extending a policy or charging additional premiums just because an insured is disabled or handicapped.

In between, we have brought a multitude of bills, both on the floor and in committee, that could have a profound effect on Kentuckians.

The Senate Health and Welfare Committee, for instance, voted out drivers ED to police find they or their passengers are not wearing seat belts.

The Senate Transportation Committee approved a bill that would help keep liquor and beer out of the hands of our young people.
