adequate protection and insurance against tort liability. Copies of the resolution were sent to appropriate legislators in Frankfort.

A request by the U.S. Department of Agriculture for the site modification of the AOCB office in the old National Guard armory on East Main was approved. An advanced computer system will be installed requiring extensive structural changes in office layout to accommodate telephone data transmission lines. The work, which includes special wiring and outlets, will be done at no expense to the county.

ON THIS recommendation of Judge/Executive Reese Smoot, County Road Foreman John Egan was rehired for four years, effective January 1, 1986. For the four-year term were East Pluck, Huseid, Myers and Smoot. Voting to re-magistrate Orville Adkins and Melvin Pryman who wanted Egan rehired for a two-year period.

A.V. Allison, representing the county-owned water district on the east end of Carlisle suggested buying over all lands collected for the district to the county. He told the court that he would continue reading meters and collect and deposit money if the county would be responsible for the payment of bills and salaries. Allison was to meet with County Attorney Jack Carter to talk over details.

IN OTHER BUSINESS, Doug Garrett was appointed to fill the vacancy on the Board of Trustees of Johnson-Mathers Health Care Inc. Garrett replaces Herbert Duncan who resigned.

Judge Smoot appointed each magistrate to the Board of Magistrates representing districts one through five. Each will receive \$100 per month expense allowance for duties performed. Magistrates were also appointed

to serve on the Welfare Committee with compensation of \$150 per month to cover costs of medicine dispensed in each district. Court voted to extend the agreement with the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet from December 31, 1985 to June 30, 1986. The project, which involves a required 10-year plan for the landfill, is being done at a cost of \$3,750.

Cuts freeze Head Start positions

The U.S. Department for Health and Human Services' regional office in Atlanta, Georgia has placed a freeze on all staff vacancies in local Head Start programs. Community Action, Lexington-Fayette County, which sponsors the Head Start early childhood development program in Fayette, Harrison and Nicholas counties, was notified that it may not fill personnel vacancies without prior authorization from HHS. The HHS freeze was taken in order to accommodate a reduction in current funds due to the Gramm-Rudman Balanced Budget Act.

Community Action officials will attempt to temporarily fill vacancies in classroom positions with volunteers in order to avoid a reduction in the number of children served. The local program serves 600 low-income children, ages three and four.

As child care licensing regulations require a ratio of one employee to every 10 children served, local officials are concerned that the freeze may ultimately require them to reduce services to children who are currently enrolled.

Head Start provides a comprehensive range of child development services, including education, health, nutrition and social services to prepare low-income children for public school. National studies have shown that Head Start is effective in helping low-income children overcome the effects of poverty and that the program saves the U.S. government \$1 for every \$1 spent on Head Start, by reducing future special education and public assistance needs.

President Reagan's budget for fiscal year 1987 proposes a reduction of Head Start funding to fiscal year 1986 levels.
