Meet MMI in District Tuesday

The Nicholas County Bluejackets will be looking for win No. 4 Friday night when Deering comes calling. It will be the final game of the regular season for the Jackets who spent play in the 37th District Tournament March 4 at Bourbon County High School gymnasium.

The Jackets posted a one-point, 25-24 win over Deering Dec. 7, a victory here tomorrow night would give coach Mike Kenney's team a much needed boost going into next Tuesday's post-season play against MMI. Game time is 7:30 p.m. The MOENJES senior faces Harrison County Thursday night.

The Jackets topped the Jackets 57-56 last month in Millersburg. Since then the play of sophomore Todd Day, Gannon Bryant and Kelly Bryant has been steadily improving. The trio was instrumental in Saturday night's 54-51 overtime win here against Sayre. Parents urged to use safety seats correctly

Education efforts by health and safety officials have increased the number of Kentucky parents who strap their young children into passenger safety seats. But many safety seats are improperly used, a situation that can be just as dangerous as not using a safety seat.

"Riding in a safety seat is the only safe way for a child to travel in a vehicle," said John Webb of the Department for Health Services. "But a safety seat protects a child only if it is used properly."

During National Child Passenger Safety Awareness Week, Feb. 23-March 1, state health and safety officials are stressing two themes — young children, according to law, must be restrained when riding in vehicles, and parents must correctly use the restraints.

"Parents should read the manufacturer's instructions on how to install the seat and how to place the child in the seat," said Webb. "For example, a small infant's seat should be installed so that the baby's back faces the dashboard. In an accident or a sudden stop, the baby's back absorbs the force rather than the infant's delicate abdomen and chest."

A complete copy of this agreement is available for public A.M. to 4:00 P.M. weekdays. Persons physically unable to get to the office can have a copy mailed or delivered to them by calling 299-2424 during those hours.

The County proposes to make the following changes:

1. Provide handicapped facilities in the men's and women's restrooms.
 2. Provide a cup dispenser for handicapped persons wishing to use the water fountain.
- It is also County policy that services provided on the second floor of the Courthouse (County Attorney's and Property Valuation Administrator's offices) shall be provided to the handicapped at an alternate location. Persons physically unable to reach those offices, may go to the Sheriff's or County Judge's office and someone will meet with them there.
