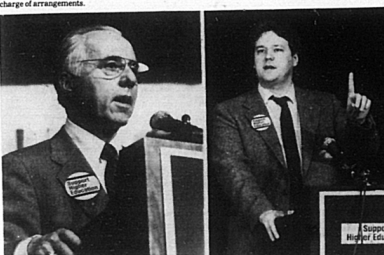
Former Mercury editor promoted at Daily Mail
