BITTERSOUTH CHURCH SQUARES

1 cupuffed old-purport flour
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/2 cup margarine
1/2 cup chopped nuts
1/2 cup chopped dates
1/2 cup shredded carrots
1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
Combine flour, oats and brown sugar in mixer until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in nuts. Pat mixture into 13"x9" baking dish. Bake at 400 degrees for 15 minutes. Stir well, drizzle about half the ice cream topping over the top. Sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Freeze Makes 9.
