The creation of safe thefts, the crime most often committed in America, is burglary. In Kentucky, there are basically three degrees of burglary. The first degree of burglary — and the most serious — is the act of breaking into a dwelling with the intent to commit a crime therein. If the perpetrator is armed, then the degree is increased to second degree. A burglary in the second degree carries a penalty of from one to 10 years in the penitentiary.

**Commonwealth comment**
