Profit prospects dim for some farm crops

A report issued this week by University of Kentucky agricultural economists indicates that some commodities grown by Kentucky farmers likely will produce lower returns than expected this year. The report, based on current market prices and cost of production, indicates that corn, soybeans, and wheat are likely to produce lower returns than expected. However, cotton and tobacco are expected to produce higher returns than expected. The report also notes that the price of cotton is expected to rise, while the price of tobacco is expected to fall.

Rainfall slows down field work

Dry weather prevailed from December through mid-May, but rainfall has been plentiful over most of Kentucky. The last couple of weeks of rain have been a boon to farmers. The report notes that the amount of rain received in Kentucky is well above the long-term average. This has helped to improve soil moisture and has allowed farmers to begin field work in many areas.

Report to Kentucky SENATOR WENDELL FORD

In recent months I had argued that tobacco, as a commodity, had already met its obligations under Gramm-Rudman. These obligations were met in the form of budget savings achieved by passing the new law in the budget bill which contained it. Passage of the new tobacco law resulted in budget savings of about \$2.5 million, which far exceeds the amount required by Gramm-Rudman. Beyond that, I have stressed that the No-Nit-Cot provisions assure that the federal budget does not pay out a dime for paying the federal government under this program. Our farmers are not giving a fair shake in the deficit reduction process. NOT LONG AGO, the future of the tobacco program looked bleak. With this pact, burley farmers do not have a single leaf of tobacco for which they alone will be responsible. Now the manufacturers and growers have entered into a partnership which will stabilize and strengthen the tobacco market. It is good economic news for the farmers, and for the state of Kentucky.

Buyout plan for burley applauded

U.S. Representative Larry J. Hopkins praised four major tobacco manufacturers for their decision to buy 100 percent of the burley in the pool of surplus tobacco offered for the Tobacco Reform Act. The action of the four companies, Philip Morris, I.J. Reynolds, Brown & Williamson and Lorillard, was applauded by Hopkins. He noted that the buyout plan would provide a fair price for the surplus tobacco and would help to stabilize the market. Hopkins also noted that the buyout plan would provide a source of revenue for the federal government.

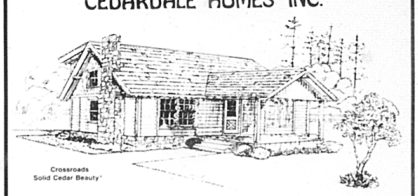
