For the 8th year in a row, the Young Planning County Fair will sponsor the Youth Talent Show on Tuesday, July 8, at 7 p.m. The fair runs for six days, July 7-12, at the Fairgrounds located on State Route 185, between Irving and Fairview, one mile off U.S. 60 at Fairview.
