Considering how well Louisville is playing this year, an opponent like Drexel or even Texas is not a bad choice of making it to Texas. However, Texas has the West Region Final. If that happens, it's Louisville's chances of moving on to the Final Four.

Kentucky is the top seed in the Southeast, but Louisville could have an interesting battle if they get past Davidson.

Davidson is the smallest school in the NCAA and has not been in the NCAA "tournament" since the 1960s when they were coached by Coach Frank McGuire.
