by Kay G. Conley (Frankfort) - City and county roads and streets could benefit from a bill facing the Kentucky General Assembly during the 1986 legislative session.

State Rep. Clay Capper, D-Day Ridge, sponsored House Bill 126 which includes an amendment to increase Kentucky's gasoline tax to improve roads. The revenue increase would be \$10 million a year.

The wholesale price of gasoline and diesel fuel would determine the amount of the gas tax. The increase would work on a sliding scale: for every two-cent decrease in gas price, the state would impose a one-cent tax, up to a maximum of five cents a gallon.

If the Kentucky General Assembly passes House Bill 126, city and county governments could have additional money to spend on their impending loss of federal funds.

State Rep. Bill Doneremeyer, D-Bellevue, is sponsoring House Bill 124, the lottery bill, which would provide additional money to cities and counties.
