deficit reduction measure which was hotly debated between the House, Senate and the White House since December. Ford said Kentucky's delegation had to work steadily to keep the tobacco reform package from being part of the controversy. "Despite the growing unpopularity of tobacco in Congress, we managed to prevent opposition during debate of the budget package," he said. FORD said the bill's motto can be traced to a "Noe Point Plan" which was approved in late 1984 by the growers, who put their bill together, can breathe a sigh of relief and be proud of their accomplishment, he said. The president's signature will give them what they have worked toward for nearly two years — and these farmers deserve credit for that.

Under the bill's provisions, the manufacturers will buy out existing pool stocks, eliminating the need for free and forced acreage. In addition, the companies will share equally in any No Net Cost assessment that arises in the future. The companies also agreed to an annual basis, to provide the Secretary that information on the assessment for the upcoming year. Their obligations under the bill will be added to the previous three-year average of exports to determine the marketing quota. In return for these concessions by manufacturers, the growers agreed to a lower price support level.
