Kay's Kitchen

With the growing popularity of popcorn, because it is good and good for you, I read where gourmet popcorn shops are popping up and serving this one lowly maize in just about any color and flavor you could think of from butter to amaretto. But despite the increasing popularity of the so-called "designer popcorns," plain old-fashioned buttered popcorn is still the best seller.

Just in case you would like to try something different:

INSTANT FLAVORED POPCORN
To 1 quart fresh popped popcorn add 1/2 tablespoon butter or margarine, melted.

Warm, low together popcorn and melted butter. Add desired flavorings.

Flavor choice: Add 1 tablespoon blue-cheese dip mix and 1/2 teaspoon garlic salt to taste.

Curry: Add 1 teaspoon ground cumin and 1/2 teaspoon garlic salt.

Spicy chili: Add 2 tablespoons chili-seasoning mix.

Parmesan: Add 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese, 1 teaspoon crushed oregano, salt to taste.

Garlic: Saute 3 cloves garlic, minced, in 1 tablespoon butter in skillet for several minutes. Add to popcorn with salt to taste.

POPCORN WITH HERBS
5 quarts popped popcorn
1 tablespoon crushed basil
1 teaspoon parsley flakes, crushed
1 teaspoon garlic powder
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese

Miss Jill Crouch receives full Transy scholarship

Dr. Charles L. Shearer, president of Transylvania University, today announced that Jill Crouch, of Mount Vernon County High School, has been named a Thomas Jefferson Scholar.

Mrs. Crouch is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Crouch, 1522 Upper Sharpburg Rd., Carlisle.

Students named Thomas Jefferson Scholars are each awarded complete scholarships covering tuition, fees, room and board. Each scholarship is valued at approximately \$20,000 over a four-year period. The program was established in 1962 by Transylvania University as a means of recognizing graduating high school seniors who show extraordinary academic ability, excellent character, a demonstrated capacity for leadership, and other strong personal attributes.

The 23 students named Thomas Jefferson Scholars were selected from over 250 applications received from across the nation. Transylvania invited 48 of those applicants to the campus for a personal interview.

Dr. Shearer noted that the selection committee faced a very difficult task in selecting only 25 scholarship recipients.

"When you are dealing with the high caliber of students who are named for these scholarships, it is extremely difficult to narrow the list to only 25 individuals. Each student invited to campus for an interview should be very proud of that accomplishment because these students rank among the most talented in the nation. We expect many positive contributions to Transylvania University from these named Thomas Jefferson Scholars today."

The Thomas Jefferson Scholars named represent 22 high schools from 14 states. The media ACT score of the group is 31, considerably higher than the national average of 18.1. Eight of the students are National Merit Finalists.
