1 pound ribhark  
1 cup sugar  
1 cup heavy cream  
Remove and discard ribhark leaves, and trim off base. Slice stalks into 1/4 inch slices. Cook in heavy sautepan with the sugar until soft. Cook quickly and do not stir. Cook long because it can become sticky and stringy if left to overheat. Taste for sweetness and add sugar if necessary. Cook 1 hour. Whip cream. Gently swirl into ribhark, leaving ribhark uncooked. To glass bowl or individual custards. Serve 4. You may use Cool Whip in place of the whipped cream for a less rich dessert.
