**CAA investigators are back** in Lexington this week either to get down to business on a probe into alleged rule violations by former members of University of Kentucky basketball or to "make a show" and wrap up its investigation begun last December with a writ that severed UK players in the Lexington area have been contacted. A source close to UK said Wednesday.

However, reporter director of athletics Cliff Hagan, the buzz went above it "former" since all members of the previous coaching staff are gone as well as players implicated in the Lexington Herald-Examiner's investigative stories last year.

In keeping with its policy, the NCAA would never confirm or deny Wednesday that it is investigating Lexington. But several former players have been contacted several days and asked if they would agree to interviews.

But they will be advised not to talk and there is nothing that can be done to make them talk, a source said. "This would be a preliminary type of thing of could be the real thing," he said.

An NCAA representative went to the apartment of one former player whereupon he told the player he would be in town for the next three weeks.

"The real thing" here is an O.I. (Official Inquiry) and is normally completed in 10 to 12 weeks. If an NCAA visit by a list of rules violations which a school is going to be officially charged with. The institution is asked to respond to them before the NCAA review makes its ruling.

One source who has evidence the NCAA has on what might do, but the ruling has been made. College sports has been taking a fair beating in recent months because of alleged rule violations (Bob Knight because of the one game suspension for "Ston" Alford at Indiana for instance), the courts in Texas judge ruled last week that the NCAA had to reveal its evidence and how it was obtained in an investigation of missives at Texas A&M and TCU. And, as always, members of the media have continued to sound the NCAA for its uneven dealings with its member schools.

However, in Kentucky's case, it seems that unless hard evidence of missives is produced, say in the form of tape recorded interviews with players and UK boosters owned by The Herald-Examiner, Kentucky basketball would seem to be in the clear.

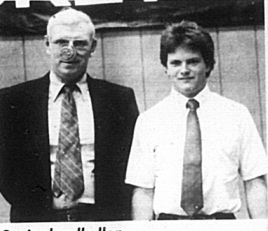
