Centre to lower prices in '87

Cable Television Company of Kentucky has announced a number of significant improvements to the cable system in Carlisle for 1987. The charge for all premium services will be reduced from \$11.95 to \$9.95. In addition, a special 18 percent discount will be offered to senior citizens 65 or older. There will no longer be an additional connection rental charge for service boxes. An 18-hour extended office and service hour will be available on week nights and Saturdays. A toll-free hot-line for after hours service will also be placed in during 1987. Carlisle residents will be treated to a number of new cable channels. Nicholas County is one of 61 Kentucky counties to be declared eligible to receive disaster assistance. The federal agency late last week announced through selected congressional offices that qualified farmers in 61 counties would all receive help. Along with Nicholas County, other central Kentucky counties include: Boone, Bracken, Clark, Harrison, Pendleton, and Robertson.

Beckstrom's first suggestion was to install a breeder valve on steam lines to each Kier so operators could bleed water out of each line. If the steam does not rise steadily, it may affect the end result of the cloth. The valves were installed and each Kier has a steady flow of steam, so they will rise more efficiently. Beckstrom's second suggestion was to weld a chain on each cap for the lead and unlead washers. Beckstrom's suggestion will eliminate the need for an operator to put his hands in the hot water to remove the caps when there is an overflow.
