**Social Security Update**

If an unemployed and someone else prepares my tax return, is there any way I can be sure I am getting proper Social Security tax credit on the self-employment Social Security tax I pay?

A. Yes, there are two ways. First, check your Federal Tax Return on schedule SE and look up on the top to make sure your Social Security number is correct. I have seen some that were not. Secondly, call your local Social Security office and request a form to get a Social Security Benefit Statement of Earnings. When you receive this form, complete it and mail it to the address of the form. You will receive a statement in a few weeks. If you have any question about the statement, call your local Social Security office for assistance.

Q. I received some official looking mail this week asking for donation to save Social Security. Is this legal and what should I do?

A. Yes, this is legal. Any person or group has the right to lobby Congress. Whether you participate in an individual election to run for Congress or you participate in a drive to get your name and address on the Social Security Administration, and Social Security is not involved in any way.

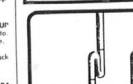
**Drive underway**
