Jackets look for depth in 1987 season

The Nicholas County High School baseball team opened its 1987 season Wednesday, April 1, with a 12-7 win over Bath County.

Junior Tip Fryman pitched the first three innings for the Jackets, with Junior Todd Day and Sophomore John Wagner going to the mound for the Jackets in relief.

These are my top three pitchers, NCHS Head Baseball Coach Bill Anderson noted.

Although Anderson's pitching corps for the Jackets is a little lean to begin this season, the veteran coach hopes the season will produce some more players to fill on the mound for his diamond-ball group.

"I'm looking for a few more good ones (pitchers) this year."

The 1987 NCHS roster includes seniors David McCarty, Wendell McInnis, Daley Holland, and Derwin Howard.

Three seniors found starting positions for Nicholas County as the Jackets opened the season. The season opener found McCarty in right field, McInnis in center, and Holland behind the plate.

This is Howard's first year playing baseball with the Jackets.

Juniors returning this year are Tip Fryman, Bryan Irwin, Scott Allen, and Day.

Rodney McDowell, a first year junior, is also on the roster.

Recently opened the season playing shortstop, Allison at five, and Day at second.

Sophomores William Workman, Andy Anderson, Rodney Hodges, Chad Michael, and Wagner are all returning from last year's team.

Those sophomores starting in the first game were Workman at third and Anderson in left field.

This is freshman Glen Stone's first year for the high school team.

Eighth grader Mike Johnson, seventh grader Brad Allison, Dan Brown, Travis Sims and Jarnal Willis begin their high school play this season.

In addition to contributing to the pitching staff, Fryman plays shortstop, Day can play for the Jackets at second or third, and Wagner in the outfield.

This is Anderson's 16th year as baseball coach at Nicholas County High School, with 15 winning seasons under his belt.

Before coming to Nicholas County, Anderson coached freshmen basketball at Simon Kenton for a year. He started his baseball coaching career at
