Nothing is worse than to give something every ounce of energy you have and then have those around you act like nothing has been done.

Although the world is certainly a competitive situation in almost no matter what you do, for many, it is necessary to give a little boost and encouragement before pushing them into a win at all cost situation.

Controversy over these and other issues have contributed to what I see as a dangerous failure to craft an energy policy serving the long-range interests of Kentucky and the nation.

By far our most important industry, coal represents about 15 percent of the earnings of primary industries and 10 percent of all industry earnings in our state.
