**EKU enrollment climbs 4 percent**

Enrollment for the 1987 spring semester at Eastern Kentucky University has increased by 4 percent over last year, University officials announced this week. Eastern officials report a total spring semester enrollment of 11,722, up by 453 over the 1986 spring semester figure of 11,271. "The increase is a direct result of efforts over the past year to make our programs at Eastern more available to larger numbers of students," said Dr. John D. Rowlett, vice president for academic affairs and research and dean of the facilities. "I think it's obvious from these figures that our efforts to better serve our designated service re-
