...this year. In addition, if he wanted to raise the rent, he would have to notify us in advance.

"Since we did not hear any more from him (Farah) we had to operate with the information we had.... the rent would be raised when the lease expired. We had nothing in writing either," Smoot said Tuesday morning on the phone.

"I can only say by what he (Farah) told me," Smoot said.

"He (Farah) came into my office and said he was going to raise the rent, and I told him there

wasn't any need to do that, since we were going to move the center to the old jail.

"At the next meeting, we (Nicholas County Floral Center) voted to move the center.

"The fact that he was planning to raise the rent to not something we just pulled out of the air."

"I will only say, though, that the rent and the increase of the rent, were only some of the considerations of moving the center to the jail," Smoot said.

"I have not been told anything different since last August," Smoot said. "It was my impression the rent was still going to be raised."
