Court hears about landfill problems at special meeting

The Nicholas County landfill and the Mathers Fund were two topics of discussion at a special meeting of the Nicholas County Fiscal Court, Tuesday evening.

The court was informed in February by the State Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) that the county landfill is deficient in some areas. The work area is the amount of topsoil needed to conform to EPA regulations.

Magistrate Orville Adkinson said, "We need to go out there and look at the landfill and see what kind of a situation we had the best landfill"

admitted, commented Magistrate Earl Lee Plank. Adkinson added, "Why does the landfill show as a 4 by 21 though it was supposed to stay open until 4:30 p.m."

A work order concerning the landfill should be issued by EPA by August 21. The court will take action upon receipt of the work order. A list of 272 Mathers Educational Fund applicants was reviewed and approved by the magistrates, after approval by the Mathers Board.

According to Imogene Green, fund administrator, acceptance is based on income. These applicants 207 are elementary students, 18,200 are high school students

(1170), and one is a student at the Kentucky School for the Deaf in Danville. Volunteers are good in Carlisle stores, only.

Green said the board has passed a few more applications each year since she accepted the fund administrator job three years ago. She said in case of an emergency such as a family's home burning, additional funds are available. Board members include Green, who acts as secretary, and Nicholas County Attorney Jack Conley, John

Allen and Betty Conrad. Final topic of discussion was a county dumpster on Dog Walk Road. George Fisher, a resident on the road, complained that Harrison County residents are using the dumpster to dispose of trash. An informational notice will be inserted in a Harrison County publication stating: only Nicholas County residents are allowed to use the county's dumpsters.
