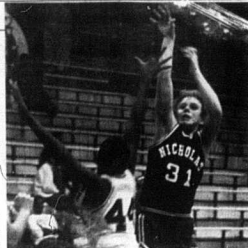
NCHS freshmen fall in season's opener, 61-34

Morehead State University improved its record to 2-0 with a 99-92 win over Ohio University, Monday night.
Eastern Kentucky's Colonial team in a 50-37 halftime advantage in posting a season opening, 115-87, victory over visiting UNC Asheville.
