IVAN S. KENDALL
 Lt. Col. Ivan S. Kendall, 72, died Wednesday, November 24, 1987, at Tripler Military Hospital.
 He was the son of the late William and Nell Green Kendall, a native of Nicholas County, and retired from the Air Force in 1961. He had made his home in Honolulu, Hawaii for the past 20 years. He was an alumnus of Carlisle High School, graduated in 1922 and entered the service in 1941 and was stationed in England during World War II. He was also stationed at Clark Air Base in the Philippines Islands, while there he was on temporary duty in Laos to set up radar for the Vietnam Conflict before the Marines were sent there between 1962-1963. He worked for Cheney King's Hardware and as a photographer as a hobby. He repaired radios and made his feature first TV at his home on Syracuse in 1946. He was in Communications while he was in the Air Force. He was also a member of the Carlisle Christian Church and Daughters Lodge.

He is survived by two nieces, one nephew, Preley W. Kendall, one adopted son Phil, two granddaughters, one grandson and one sister-in-law, Mrs. Walters.
