Health TipsLee Rose

Four recent cases of meningitis in children of Fayette County make Haemophilus more than a remote illness affecting youngsters.

Parents take notice and watch to make if their young children are exposed to be infected, and if so what precautions can be taken.

Most people are familiar with bacterial meningitis which is quite contagious and takes one to seven days to incubate.

Symptoms which are not always apparent in young children are stiff neck, fever, headache, irritability, vomiting and convulsions.

Not being familiar with Haemophilus or Hib as it is commonly called, it is important to know Hib is the most common cause of bacterial meningitis as well as other serious diseases.

A safe Hib vaccine has been available to children ages two to five for the past few years.

Because Hib is readily passed from child to child it is strongly recommended for eighteen months to two-year olds attending day care or similar child care groups.

When Hib is given under 24 months, a second should be given about 12 months after the first but not before age 2.
