"We've played over 200 games this season and I'm ready to rest awhile. All that driving and practicing gets tiring. The chairs used in competition are not the variety one might see in a hospital which weigh about 60 pounds. 'I'm using a pair of my old chairs and never realized what a task it was until I tried one of the lightweight sports models made for basketball,'" said Kelley.

"All of a sudden the other guys couldn't guard me and found themselves changing me all over the place. A good chair makes all the difference. Kelley's chair weighs about 18 pounds. It is made of a light weight metal which is handy to carry. The front wheels are most crucial. They are easy to turn and the back wheel and the back wheel are wheelchair.
