Organizational session

The selection of legislative leaders and committee chairs will dominate discussion when the General Assembly convenes its 1987 Organizational Session at 10 a.m. on Tuesday. The session may last no more than two legislative days. The first order of business will be electing 23 legislators who will be freshmen when the 1987 regular legislative session is convened into the first year of their terms. In addition, seven committee chairs of the first-year Representatives, 22 are in the House of Representatives and nine in the Senate. Democrats retained control of both chambers.

The margin is 19-7 in the House and 9-4 in the Senate — a net gain of one seat for the Democrats in the Senate and for the GOP in the House from the 1986 totals. The new legislators are their first glimpse of the General Assembly during a two-day orientation session on December 11-12. The House will elect its Speaker and the Senate its President. The start of another year marks the time hunters and fishermen across the state usually head to the country to enjoy the sports of the season. Many will purchase hunting and fishing licenses for the year. The Department of Fish and Wildlife Commission, for resident hunters, fishing and combination licenses were increased \$1 over last year. A 1987 hunting license costs \$8.50, fishing license \$5.50 and combination license \$11. A new license can usually be obtained by mail.
