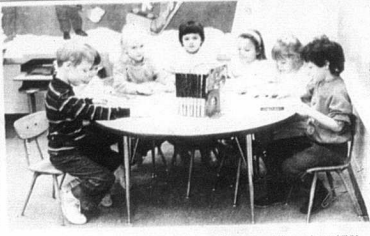

Beautiful: Tips from the Hart

STAY AWAY FROM DARK SMOG. Eye shadow is used to call attention to your eyes, not to cover power them. Avoid bright green, blue, turquoise or other very bright shades. The darker your face, the more color you should use. Eye shadow should always be sure that the color of your eyes is more prominent than the eye shadow.

Think of your eye area as being divided into three parts: the lid, the crease, and the lower base. Shade the crease in a deeper color. This will define the shape of the eye. A lighter color under the lower and a soft color on the lid. Properly placed shadows are easy to use. Choose shadow can be easier to apply to dry or wrinkled skin, but powder shadow will work well. Avoid any frosted shadow if you have wrinkled lids, not are they great powder, not as natural as matt.
