A Hot Fudge Sundae. Oh, yes, and a diet soda. While these sugar substitutes may not help in your weight loss program, they may be involved in weight gain. A few years ago a test was done with 60,000 women who were matched with their use of artificial sweeteners over the course of a year. It was found that the sugar substitutes failed to help weight loss.

Also, the women who used them tended to gain weight. While those who did not use sugar substitutes tended to remain at the same weight.

Could it, people assume that they switch from sugar to sugar substitutes they can indulge in rich desserts and other high-calorie foods without suffering the consequences. Even though drinking a can of diet soda instead of the regular kind will save close to 150 calories, just one can of diet soda with chocolate cake will "use up" the saved calories and you will have a heavy coffee drinker, someone who has five cups a day will save only about 100 calories by adding a sugar substitute.

In a sense, artificial diet solutions of sweeteners with saccharin ended up increasing eating more than sugar. Because diet soda sweetened with sugar, plus a possible blubber over it. When the calories do not appear the body is tricked into believing it is hungrier than it might have been before the sugar substitute was eaten.

Another study researchers report that artificial sweeteners result in a 40 percent increase in the signals to the brain. The result can be a loss of control over the appetite.

Artificial sweeteners can be of some benefit to people trying to control their weight. But they are not the perfect answer. A glass of water is a more effective way to control weight loss than any other sugar free alternative.

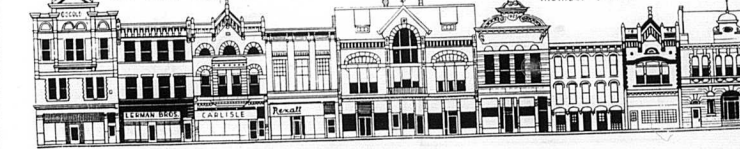
